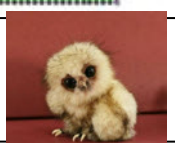

THE SHOOTING SPORTS - JUNE 2013 RANGE REPORT

1. For all our members safety and for emergency situations we have now installed new First Aid Kits on all the ranges, lets hope we never have to use them.
2. The new "Sydenham Sportsmen's Association Shooting Range Operations Manual" has now been distributed to every club member. We would like to remind everyone that if you have not already done so please sign and return the Declaration on the last page which states you have read, understand, and will abide by these rules. Hard copies of the manual and the declaration will continue to be available at any of the upcoming General Meetings, just ask Bill Douglas or Al Hillis.
3. For those of you who shoot 22 rimfire or Cowboy action will notice the improvements on Range #2. We now have brand new target holders and shrouds set up at the bullet stop on this range. I would like to thank those hardworking members from the CBA group and all those who took the time and effort to make these improvements. Your help was very much appreciated. Stand by for some more improvements on this range in the upcoming months.
4. As most of you are aware our last range inspection by the CFO's office pointed out that we must raise the height of the 100 yd range [#3] backstop berm on the right hand side to meet the current regulations. We received an extension until July 1st to complete this work, and will be looking for some volunteers to help out. It will probably be on very short notice as we have a limited window when we can get the equipment at a price we can afford.
5. A special thanks goes out to Georgian Bay Chemical for donating Purell Hand Sanitizer's/Cleaners to be installed on every range. These are great for cleaning up any GSR, lead or just disinfecting your hands after your shoot. Let us know if you like them.

On April 19th we stocked into Owen Sound Bay 62,475 yearling Brown trout that averaged 14 centimeters in length and 34.1 grams in weight, and then on May 1st 10,888 Rainbow trout weighing an average of 29.5 grams and measuring approximately 14.5 centimeters in length were stocked into the Sydenham River at Harrison Park.

At this time the hatchery has approximately 98,200 Rainbow trout eggs that were collected at the Owen Sound Mill Dam between April 8th and April 30th. In addition to this we also have 97,900 Brown trout fry and 74,900 Chinook salmon fingerlings that are being taken care of by our hatchery volunteers.

With the winter finally being behind us, we now need to think about getting the hatchery septic tanks and kidney pond cleaned out, before the hotter summer months arrive. To this end we are looking at the morning of Monday, June 3rd to get this job done. Five or six SSA volunteers would be appreciated for this task, and hopefully we won't have a lot of difficulty in finding them. Anyone wanting to help should give me a call at 519-371-5295, and I'll put you on the schedule and keep you posted if there is a change to the plan.

Funding and Assistance Applications –

Community Hatchery Program – This is a new program that in the past had been part of MNRs CFWIP. Unlike CFWIP, this new program deals specifically with community based fish hatcheries across the province, and will be administered by the Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters. The details of the program are still being developed, and as a result, the application forms have still not been made available to interested hatchery operators.

LIBRO Financial Fund – An application for \$5,000 was made to LIBRO Financial this past March, looking for adequate funding assistance for three or more School Salmon Hatchery Programs in the area. We have been asked to assist a few schools with this program, and the dollars would really come in handy. Results of our application should be known by July 15th, or shortly thereafter.

Land Stewardship And Habitat Restoration Program – This is a new MNR program whose elements were also once a part of MNRs old CFWIP. This new program is focused of land and stream projects, but unlike CFWIP, which had at \$4,000 maximum per project, this one has been increased to a maximum of \$20,000 or fifty percent of the project cost, whichever comes first. The dollars are greater, but organizations are limited to only one project application per year. On May 1st I submitted an application for approximately \$9,500 for a Side Channel Spawning Bed project that will total about \$19,000 by the time it is finished. The project involves the removal and replacement of the earthen / culvert structures that feed and control the flow of water through the two spawning bed sections, with a few upgrades and modifications being made where needed. The application form did not specify as to when a decision would be made, but I would expect that word should be received sometime before the middle of July.

Stewardship Ranger Program - This program is again in operation for 2013, and the SSA has made application to have five Stewardship Ranger Team Members give us three days of help at the Side Channel Spawning Beds near Inglis Falls. I've discussed the work being considered with Jody Scheifley from the Owen Sound MNR, and upon my suggestion and his support, we will have one or two members from his office on site to assist and guide the rangers in the removal and redistribution of the spawning bed gravel that has accumulated over the years. By the time they are finished, the spawning beds should be in much better condition and more suited to the spawning activity that takes place there.

Bill Stonehouse Property Stream Fencing Project –

Although this project was noted as being completed last fall, we are still committed to bring in two loads of gravel to put the finishing touches to the cattle crossing area. Once the farmland has dried off sufficiently, I will be placing the order and having it delivered to the site, at Mr. Stonehouse's convenience. Bill will be placing the material where it is needed, so there no need for direct involvement by the SSA for now. This project could be further enhanced by the addition of trees and grasses in various spots along the stream. If the Wildlife Advisory Committee would like to have a look at the property, I'd be glad to walk the stream with them and discuss the options available. Perhaps this could be a project that the WAC and FAC could undertake jointly.

Owen Sound Tourism / Owen Sound Salmon Run Tour & The Sydenham Sportsmen's Association – I met with Ms. Paulette Peirol from the OS Tourism organization to discuss their ideas to promote tourism to the Owen Sound area in the fall of the year. In addition to creating a “route” to facilitate visitors viewing the salmon as they move up the Sydenham River to the foot of Inglis Falls, they are looking at creating a DVD which will include the fisheries activities of the SSA as it relates to the salmon. The final DVD will be utilized by them to promote tourism in the area, and in return for our help and guidance in its creation, copies will be given to the SSA for our use at trade / boating / fishing shows, etc. We will be contacting them when we do spawning bed work, egg collections, fish stocking, and hatchery work, so they can be present at those times to do photo/video shoots of what is taking place at the time. These photos will be part of the finished DVD that we will be using and which will be made available for sale to visitors, as souvenirs of their visit. They already have all the funding required for this project, so all we have to do is help them in the fieldwork. Sometime before the middle of June we will have to get a work crew together to clean and organize our hatchery facility; after which we will need to keep it neat and tidy (indefinitely). We don't want to give a bad impression to the public, especially when it's being documented for all to see at some point. Again, volunteers will be required for this hatchery clean up project, so we hope that an e-mail or telephone call to our members will quickly fill our needs on this.

Side Channel Spawning Beds –

Time and the elements have taken their toll on the Side Channel Spawning Beds, and we now are faced with the need to do some major work on them, if we hope to continue having them serve as spawning areas for trout and salmon. An application for funding has been submitted to the MNR's LSHRP (see above), to cover half the costs of the work, and we are now just waiting to receive their approval. Whether the funding comes through or not is beside the point; the work needs to be done, and it will need to be completed before this fall's Chinook salmon run.

Future Stream Enhancement Projects –

A couple of potential projects have been brought to my attention; both involving sections of Bothwell's Creek. In addition to working on all the projects that will be taking place this summer and fall, we will be taking a closer look at these future projects, to determine what can be done to resolve the issues they present. During the process we will be developing plans, estimates, etc. and have the necessary details ready to use when we make funding applications to various programs available for this type of work.

School Salmon Hatchery Program –

The School Salmon Hatchery Program, at Bayview Public School, seems to be going very well. A sufficient supply of fish food, in various sizes, was delivered to the school early this year. Since no problems have popped up so far, we expect that the result to be seen at the end of the school year will quite likely be as good as last year.

We have received enquiries from other area schools that are looking at setting this program up at their locations. To be able to meet the potential demand, we have sought funding assistance from the LIBRO Financial Group (see above).

Fish Fry June 8th

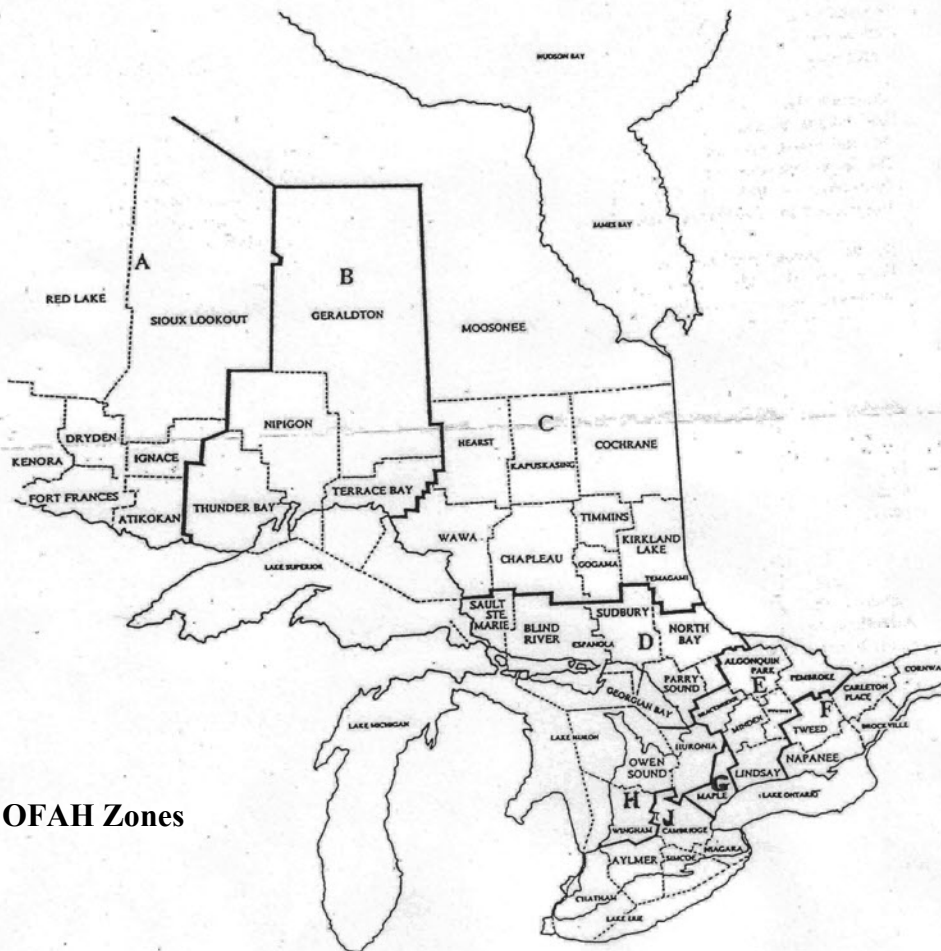

Please complete all required sections every time you take a guest to shoot on one of our ranges. There will also be new Guest Waiver sheets to sign once they have been approved by our legal beagles.

Remember the ' no high gun ' rule...keep the muzzle of your gun below the top of the target frame.

Please pick up your brass and put it in the cans provided.

There are spare target holding boards at the range. If you see that one needs replacing, please do so . Dan and Mark do an excellent job of keeping our range functioning so let's make their job a little easier. " Thank you " Mark and Dan.

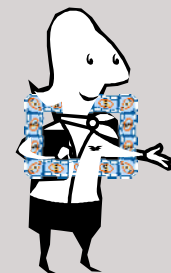
SSA Twin County Bounty Hunters working on the new Cowboy Action Range.
