

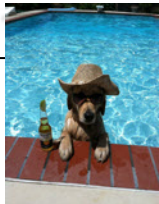

You need to be aware that a requirement for new members in 2019 is that the firearms licence number and expiry date needs to be included. As well, we require new members to provide a current police criminal records check.

Range Use Guideline

Due to several recent issues and questions that have come up in regards to what firearms can be used on which ranges. The SSA feels it is important to clarify a few things to ensure members are following the SSA rules, and that the club is compliant with the Chief Firearms Office range approvals.

Range #1, 20 yard Handgun Range

Firearms approved to be used on this range are [Handguns and Rimfire rifles](#) (.22 short/long/long rifle/ magnum and 17HMR).

No shotguns, center fire rifles (including pistol caliber carbines) are to be used on this range.

Range #2 25 yard Rimfire Range

Firearms approved to be used on this range are [Rimfire Rifles](#) (.22 short/long/long rifle/ magnum and 17HMR)

No handguns , shotguns, center fire rifles (including pistol caliber carbines) are to be used on this range.

Range #3 100 Yard Rifle Range

This range can only be used under the supervision of a club approved RSO, see the club calendar or email notice for the monthly 100 yard schedule.

Firearms approved to be used on this range are [Centerfire rifle](#) (including Pistol Caliber Carbines), [Rimfire Rifle](#), [Muzzleloaders](#), and [Shotguns with Slugs](#).

When using Handguns and Shotguns with buckshot they can only be fired forward of the 50 yard bullet catch.

There are 2 shotgun patterning boards available to members on the trap / skeet field. The steel one with paper is for use of shot size up to #4, (great for turkey patterning) the other patterning board is only to be used for shot sizes #7.5- #9 and uses a grease to show the shot pattern.

The trap, skeet and sporting clays ranges have scheduled times for when they are open to the membership, please check the club calendar. No personal clay target throwers are allowed on the ranges.

*****Please note that there are specific, approved activities that allow the use of firearms on certain ranges other than what is listed above. These activities include Cowboy action shooting, defensive pistol, and any other shooting activity pre approved by the SSA/ CFO. These activities can only take place when they are scheduled, approved and / or supervised by the appropriate RSO's *****

There are security cameras on all ranges and any complaints or range damage found instigates a review of the footage to determine what went on. Moving forward range use violations will be followed up with disciplinary action as per the SSA bylaws.

## Power to the pollinators!

The Government of Canada recognizes the importance of protecting the biodiversity and quality of Canada's waters, including the Great Lakes. We are preserving and protecting the Great Lakes and their considerable social, economic and spiritual benefits from the harmful impacts of invasive species.

Grass carp, one of four species of Asian carp, has the potential to disrupt the Great Lakes ecosystem and economy unless their spread is stopped, according to a report released today by Fisheries and Oceans Canada with support from the Great Lakes Fishery Commission and the Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry. The socio-economic study concludes that, in addition to the significant ecological threat that is posed by the presence of grass carp in the Great Lakes, there would also be economic, social and cultural ripple effects.

## Gate Keys

As you are probably aware, the gate locks were changed on April 1. You need a key with a green key spotter in order to open club gates. Make sure you wear your membership card with the 2019 sticker on the back. If you are using SSA facilities and don't have your membership card on, expect other members to check to make sure you are a paid up SSA Member. Keys are available at Watsons Tackle House, the Maher centre and at club meetings.

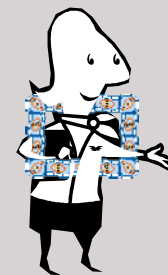


## **Volunteers - Thank you -**
