# **Fisheries Advisory Committee**

### Fish Hatchery

We were successful in collecting our allotment of Chinook Salmon eggs, we got 105,000 eggs, from the mill dam with our last collection on the thanksgiving weekend. The Lake Huron Fishing club and the Sarnia Bluewater Anglers were also successful this year in getting their collection. We want to thank the MNRF and Grey Sauble Conservation Authority for their help.

This is not an easy task for any of us with timing the salmon run and coordinating manpower. We want to thank all of the volunteers who came out to get the job done. Collecting eggs down at the mill dam is a high profile event for our clubs with a lot of public interest and subsequently support for our programs.

The eggs in the incubation trays have eyed up now, a visible black dot

inside the amber egg, indicating that the egg has been fertilized and can be sorted out from the dead white eggs. This also is a necessary but tedious job. Fortunately our mechanical engineer, well kind of, Craig Geberdt, and his apprentice Wyatt resurrected an egg sorting machine used many years ago by his father Fred Geberdt. This turned out to be very helpful just like Fred was.

We have around 95,000 rainbow trout in our small hatchery from eggs collected last May that are doing very well thanks to their daily feedings from our regular volunteers.
