Recently the SSA Executive reinstated the Club Awards for 2023. We will forward more information to you next month. But want to give you a quick overview now. One cardinal rule is that these entries must come from Grey or Bruce counties and must be harvested by current club members.

First, we have the Big Fish awards. They include Chinook Salmon, Rainbow Trout, Brown Trout and Brook Trout. We have trophies for Adults, Students and Juniors in these categories. In each case, you complete an application form, which we hope to have available on our website within the next month. You are required to measure the fork length and girth, take a photo on your phone and have a witness. You can release the fish and still enter it.

We also have a Best Buck contest, where the antiers will need to be measured using the Boone and Crockett criteria. Finally, we have a Best Turkey Trophy.

Another category of the Awards programme is the Hard Luck award. Some of you will remember the great fun we had at the Awards Ceremony with Fred Geberdt regaling us with stories about the Hard Luck winners. We have 2 awards for this category. First and Second place. 

Reloading Workshop

A Special Event Announcement- Reloading Workshop On Saturday February 11, 2023 from 10:00 to 12:30, there will be a Reloading Workshop held at the Kincardine Nimrod Club Clubhouse (KNC). This workshop, with the emphasis on safe reloading of shotgun, rifle and handgun ammunition, will cover everything from the basics of why, to the how and beyond. Just some of the topics discussed are safe reloading, the basics, costs and economic benefits, why reload, equipment and reloading components, and pitfalls that can be avoided, followed by a Q & A session where the audience is encouraged to share their experiences. Our cameras are now up and running. Keep up the good safety practices.





February 2023 SSA Newsletter – Range Committee update

Welcome to 2023. The warmer than usual weather has meant that the ranges have been busier than normal for the first few weeks of January. Depending on weather (!) you are a skier, snowmobiler, or not – you might find this winter easier than normal. Light snow conditions have meant that moving around the ranges have been easy so far this year.

The 2023 range committee welcomes our newest member – John Stockmann. John has volunteered to lead on the care and maintenance of the Handgun Range AND will help co-ordinate training courses on this range as well in the future. The range committee members and all their contact info can be found under the Ranges tab on our website.

We hosted the first club Orientation tour this year on Sunday January 29th. The next one will be in March or Early April – date to be determined. Although the primary reason for these tours is to educate new members on the basic range rules so that they can start to use the ranges, its also about introducing everyone to our club facilities and the other conservation activities the club is involved in. If you have been a member for many years already – this is your invitation to come to the next orientation tour and get updated on what we are doing as a club. Watch the website All Events calendar and the newsletters for future dates.

Chuck Cannons Handgun Proficiency training modules are back! Times two. Chuck has generously offered to teach his series of Five Handgun Proficiency modules this year at our club - the first series in the spring will tentatively run from April 2nd every other week ending May 27th . The second series will repeat in the late summer/fall. Both training sessions will finish with a challenging "qualification shoot" on the 100 yard range - hosted by Chuck – which will present an interesting variety of shooting challenges. Not only are these training sessions a great way to build your skills with your handgun, for those members wanting to get holster certified at our club you can achieve this by attending all of the first four training dates with Chuck.

Registration is required for this Handgun training with Chuck – with the plan for online via our website – watch for full details in the next club newsletter and on our website calendar.

Chuck is ALSO looking for a member volunteer (or two) with an interest in Handgun shooting to be involved in these Handgun courses as instructor trainees. There would be no cost involved in participating as an instructor trainee. The ideal candidate would be someone who has taken his courses in the past - but it is not required.

We are planning the first Handgun Range safety courses and 100 yard range safety courses of 2023 for late winter/early spring. Reach out to if you are interested in getting your handgun sticker or Trevor is you want to get your 100 Yard range sticker.

The SSA Sporting Clays course is looking for a new helper for 2023. Do you have some experience shooting sporting clays, and want to get involved and learn more about the sport? Have you ever put some thought into what the targets are doing, and why? We are looking for someone to help with the sporting clays machines setup and course maintenance. We can teach you what you need to know. The Interclub Trap league will start this year on April 29th with the first shoot hosted by North Grey Bruce Rod & Gun Club. All the dates for the 9 scheduled shoots are posted on our website.

There will be private range rentals again in 2023 on the Handgun range, Rimfire range, and 100 yard range during which time they will be closed for individual shooting activities. The ranges are also closed to members when training courses are being held. REMEMBER to check the All Events calendar before you go to the club to see if the range you want to use is available. We are trying our best to put range closed notices on the calendar as early as possible so that no one gets surprised when they arrive that a range might not be available.

100 Yard Range

At the end of November, a review was conducted of all of the range users from April when we started the 100 Yard Range Users course. The 100 Yard Range Users course had 109 members complete the course.

From the first courses completion to the end of November the log sheets showed:

- There were 478 entries that were legible,
- The range was used by 120 members (some members used it multiple times during that time-frame),
- Records showed that the 120 users of the range were either Range Safety Officers or members who completed the 100 yd Range Users Course,
- There was a total of 38 guest during that time frame.

During that same timeframe unannounced inspections during shooting activities were conducted by one of the Range Co-ordinators and there were no non-compliances with SSA Range Operations requirements observed.


However, during a 100-yard Range Inspection in the middle of December it was found that the 100 marker for lane 1 was missing. On closer inspection the marker was actually shot so bad through the target structure that it just folded over. It was concluded that the possible reason for this is:

- Targets not placed properly on the backer boards,
- Firearms not sighted in properly, or
- Wilful disregard for SSA assets by shooters (which we hope is not the case).

In addition, lots of brass was found in the concreted area that was not picked up by shooters when they are done and left for other to pick up.

Most of the shells are rimfire shells. If these practices continue the range committee may have to look at the use of the 100-yard Range by individuals and possibly look at options of preventing this in the future. I know a lot of members like to use the range on their own, but if these practices of others continue there may be no other option.

Users of the 100-yard Range please treat this range as if it was your own range and let's keep it clean and safe.



Range Operations – Use of Targets

SSA has to submit a copy of Range Operations Manual to the Chief Firearms Office (CFO) on a regular basis for review and acceptance as part of the ongoing approval for Continued Range Operations. Recently it has been brought to the Range Committees attention that there is some misunderstanding regarding the use of steel targets on the Handgun, 22 Cal Rim Fire Range and the 100yd High Powered Range. The SSA Operations Manual clearly states that: "Only paper targets are to be used on the ranges, mounted on backers between the support rails. The only allowed exception is the use of shrouded steel targets for sanctioned Cowboy Action, IDPA, & Precision Rimfire Shooting, with a minimum distance to target of 10 yards."

Sanctioned events need to be scheduled and identified in the event calendar on the SSA Website and require an SSA Approved Range Safety Officer during the event.

If steel targets are being used outside of sanctioned events, it will result in the CFO asking additional information regarding the accepted Range Operations Manual, SSA's enforcement of the Range Operations Manual requirements and possible loss of the approval to continue operating the ranges.

Sanctioned events are not difficult to arrange in the SSA Calendar. Please contact the Range Co-ordinators.

I do not think that anyone wants to lose the operation approval of the ranges. If you have any questions or concerns, please reach out to the SSA Range Committee Members identified in the Range Operation Manual and the SSA Website.

Rimfire Precision Shooting

There have been some inquiries to a possible "Precision Rimfire Shooting Event" by our members.

A SSA Range Safety Officer has come forward and is willing to set up the 100-Yard Range with precision steel targets in the 100-yard bunkers and possible shrouded targets at the 25- and 50-yard backstops.

These events are open to all current SSA members and their guest. Please check the SSA website event calendar for dates and times. Currently these are scheduled for Sunday Afternoons.
